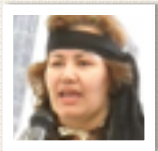
2014 Progress thanks in part to your support

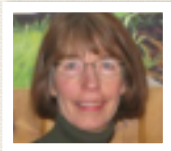

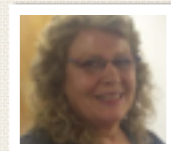
Three Arts Champions were honored for their exemplary work in arts instruction, support and promotion.

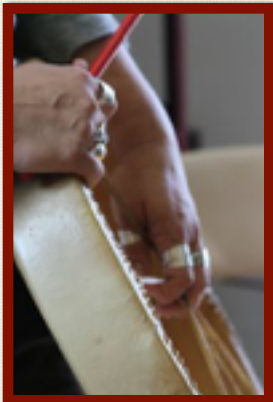
